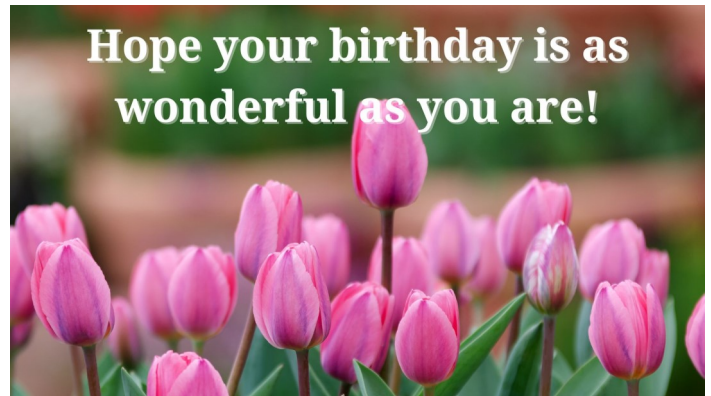

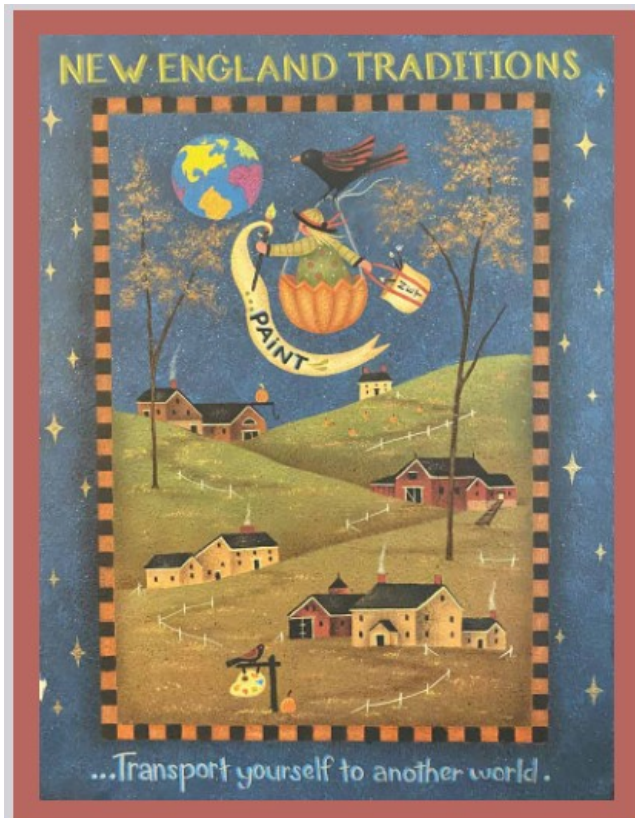

BROWN BAG RAFFLE

Gather your unwanted treasures and bring them to our White Mountain Guild meetings to raffle off! You may place them in boxes, brown or plastic shopping bags, whatever works for you...will work for the Guild. What a great way to evaluate your supplies and earn money for our guild. Treasures may include surfaces, books, patterns, painted items, paint...

General Meeting Raffle Rules

- Raffle is held at general meetings
- Members will bring bagged or boxed items to be raffled in new or like new condition
- Painting supplies, surfaces, paint, mediums, books, magazines, useful items
- Painted items
- Tickets will be sold at the general meeting

Tips & Tricks

- To prevent damage to your favorite liner brushes store them in plastic drinking straws.
- Use the lid from a prescription bottle, a salt cellar or dappen dish to keep clean water for floating. (This tip comes from Ann Hunter)
- When adding dots to a project – put a drop of paint on your opposite thumb nail to dip your stylus in. (I learned this trick from Nancy Scott)
- Two ways to find the end of your tape:
Put a paper clip under the edge of tape end.
Leave a tail by turning tape under at a right angle.
- To keep the back of a project clean, cover it with Press n' Seal (Chris Watson shared this tip)

This is a way to make circles without a compass. Plastic canvas available at Hobby Lobby or Michaels. Cut a strip 5 squares wide and 5 to 6 inches long. Use a pin or small stylus at your center point then put your sharp marking pencil in a square above the center in the same line of squares and make your circle. This is a great way to make circles very close together. Credit for this brilliant idea goes to Jadel Rocks on Facebook.

Recipe

STARBUCKS COPYCAT LEMON LOAF

3 large eggs, room temperature
1 c. sugar
1 c. sour cream
1/2 c. veg. oil
zest of 1 large lemon
2 Tablespoons lemon extract
1/2 tsp. vanilla extract
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/4 tsp. baking soda
1/4 tsp. salt



Icing: 1 c. conf. sugar, 1 T. lemon juice and approximately 1 T. milk. Whisk together until smooth.
Greased 9x5 loaf pan. 350 degrees.

Eggs, sugar and sour cream in a large bowl. Beat with a hand mixer until smooth. Slowly add the oil, mixing on low speed. Add lemon zest, lemon and vanilla extracts, beating until combined. Add flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Stir just until combined - do not over mix. Ok to leave some lumps. Pour into pan. Bake 43-45 min. or until top is light brown and it tests clean with a toothpick. Cool completely in pan on wire rack. Remove and apply the glaze while on the wire rack.

Note: In the last 10-15 minutes check the top of the bread and put foil on top if too brown.

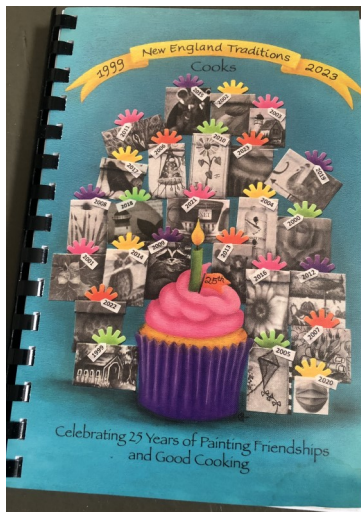
