2024 AFTERNOON PROGRAMS

Meeting Minutes Terumi Irizawa



Meeting was called to order at 10:01 AM

Secretary - Terumi Irizawa

 Approval of Nov. 18, 2023 minutes. Chris Watson made a motion to accept the minutes from Nov. 18, 2023. Jean Paglio seconded the motion. All were in favor.

Treasurer - Chris Watson

- Melissa and Julia volunteered to be on the audit committee.
- Kathy Slawsky, Maria C, and Terumi volunteered to be on Chris' budget committee. Nancy will be an observer and available for questions.
- Chris provided an example of the teacher fees (\$250) associated with an upcoming meeting. If 10 people sign up for the program (@\$30/student), we will have covered the costs of the teacher's fee.

1st Vice Presidents - Barbara Rolla and Anne Hunter

- Afternoon programs March, June, and September
 - o **March** Lynne Andrews we have 11 signed up so far. Prepped surfaces cost \$6. The theme of the meeting, including Show, Share and Tell is "The Wearing of The Green".
 - o June Bonnie Frederico colored pencils. Information will be in the January newsletter.
 - September Barbara Rolla Santa project. We will need to order the 12-inch surface (Santa) by May 1st. The cost will be \$10. Barbara will bring the surfaces to the June meeting. The members may use surfaces of their own choice.
 - o Dates for 2024 workshops to be held at Anne Hunter's studio.
 - o **April 20**th Jean Paglio (watercolor)
 - **Aug 3rd** Carol Peck (stamps and watercolor markers). A short supply list will be provided.
- Anne and Barbara have received only 14 survey responses regarding the possibility of having a retreat in 2025.
- Laurie is going to create an electronic survey. Even if you have completed the written survey, please submit the electronic survey.

- Anne and Barbara are very interested in seeing the suggestions for teachers. Members expressed interest in teachers that are local.
- We discussed whether we would attract members from remote locations if we offered afternoon programs, workshops, and retreats via Zoom.

Membership - Jane Stone-Tatro

- 32 members have joined (30 renewals and 2 new members). 11 have not rejoined. Jane will reach out to those members.
- Membership form has an option to include desired teachers She will send the information to Anne and Barbara.
- Nancy asked Jane to send the emails of the 2 new members to Terumi and Sandy for future emails related to NET.

President – Nancy Mullen

- All NE and NY presidents agreed to holding collaboration meetings during the year. The first meeting will be on Feb. 5th.
- Nancy was speaking to the church about doing a class for them, to thank them for the use of the room. They wondered whether we would be willing to offer a painting class for their youth group fundraising auction.
- If there is enough interest, Nancy suggested that we form a committee (at the March meeting) to organize the trunk show (or whatever it will be named).
- Nancy is going to work with the church to test out the projection system (for future use for Zoom or hybrid classes).

<u>Newsletter</u> – Maria Costantini, Newsletter Deadline is Friday, January 26, 2024. Maria mentioned that we will no longer charge the \$5 for a printed copy of the newsletter.

Community Service - Melissa Walsh

- 20 boxes were delivered (by Chris) to the Disabled American Veterans' home in December.
- Julia also delivered 10 boxes to Visitation House and Abby's House during the year.
- Melissa will put the measurements of the boxes into the newsletter. Members may want to decoupage or apply other materials to the top of the box.
- Melissa bought pajamas to put into the backpacks. Pam asked if we could donate checks instead of painting a box or backpack. Melissa is happy to accept checks as this will allow her to purchase items to put into the backpacks.

Fundraising/Craft Fair - Maria Costantini

- Maria volunteered to continue to be the chairperson in 2024.
- We believe that the fair will be held on Nov 9^{th.} Nancy will confirm the date.
- We do have some pins left. We could convert them to ornaments.
- One suggestion was to sell lawn flags or pennants (using Roc-Lon). Nancy questioned whether these would sell, due to the low cost of these at box stores.
- We could sell smaller ornaments, as some donated ornaments were too large for a tree. Other ornament themes: nutcracker theme. Green wreaths for inserts were discussed as an alternative to grapevine wreaths.
- Nancy had thought that the grapevine wreath would be covered by the painted piece as opposed to being an insert in the center of the wreath.
- Carol Peck has some holiday themed cutting boards that she is willing to donate to the fair.
- Please send all ideas to Maria. There is a space limitation so please keep that in mind.

- Travelling Ted Mary St. Pierre still requires samples done using colored pencils, oils, and mixed media. She has pieces done using watercolor, acrylics and zentangle.
- Julia has various art books that are too heavy to put into the raffle baskets. Julia suggested that we donate them to the Blessing Barn in Mendon. There is a building devoted to books and the money raised by selling the books goes to support the community of Mendon. Julia also noted that the Blessing Barn will take donations of craft supplies. We all agreed that donating the books to the Blessing Barn was a good idea.

A motion was made by Sandy to adjourn the meeting at 11:39 am. It was seconded by Jane. All were in favor.

We will be needing breakfast items for our next in-person meeting which will be the March 16, 2024 meeting. Fundraising -Tantasqua Craft Fair Maria Costantini



We will have a booth at the 2024 Tantasqua Craft Fair. It is a great fundraiser for our guild thanks to our generous members who painted items. The exact date has not been announced by the school yet, but we think, tentatively, it will be Saturday, November 9, 2024. When I get the paperwork with the exact date, I will let you know.

This past year we added grape vine wreaths and wreath "inserts" to our product line. The "inserts" sold well, we sold more than half of the painted pieces. Unfortunately, the actual wreaths did not sell so we are going to change only the actual wreaths to possibly smaller grape vine wreaths and/or an evergreen wreath as a display option.

This year we have purchased some wooden shapes from the Dollar Store that will be available for our membership to paint more beautiful designs on or you can go to your local Dollar Store and pick some up to paint. These can be used the same as the wreath inserts or just as decorations on a door or wall.

We will continue with our tree ornaments; they are our best sellers. Customers have asked for ornaments with teachers, dogs, cats, music, and nutcracker designs as well as the traditional Christmas designs. We did notice that the larger ornaments did not fit on trees very well so try to pick surfaces that will fit on a branch of a tree and not hang down several branches, around 2"- 3" long.

We sold some more pins this year, but we still have quite a few left and they are beautiful. We will try to convert some of these pins to ornaments and hope they sell as ornaments.

Yankee members have been very generous painting items for our fundraiser. We all look forward to seeing the beautiful pieces you will paint for the craft fair this year!





Last Fall I heard a report that the Farmer's Almanac predicted that the 2023-2024 Winter was going to be very snowy. Because I was going to retire from work, after 53 years, I said, "snow away". I'll watch it snow sitting in my living room with a hot cup of tea in a nice warm house. The man across that street will plow me out so I don't have to shovel so I say, "snow away".

I doubt there are many members of our guild (other than myself) that are saying "snow away" this year. I watch the weather and they are reporting considerable snow accumulation to the West, North and South of where I live.

As I look out my window today, the last week of January, I see bare ground, even the grass is bare. We have had plenty of precipitation, whenever you got snow, we got snow but only an inch or two of snow and then it rained and washed it all away. I guess that's the benefit of living on the coast.
